## **“Las Margaritas”**

### **Escuela Rural Mixta Alma Rodas de Fallos y Jardin de Ninos Sol Resplandicientos Honduras**

This project included the renovation of one existing classroom, the demolition of an existing kindergarten lean-to structure and the construction of two new kindergarten classrooms with washrooms. The project includes our “maple leaf kite” mural .



## **“Storefront School “**

### **Kinder Emerita Castellanos Honduras**

With a new site this school replaces a temporary school that was accommodated in a storefront. The project includes a new classrooms and washrooms and a playground.





## **“The Jungle School “**

### **Escuela Luis Alfonso Guerra**

Located in a remote village, Brisas el Congo, the “Jungle School” includes a new classroom with adjacent washrooms and a playground. SCW Canada has also provided furniture and school supplies.





## New Projects to be Completed in 2016/2017

We have two projects currently under construction: “ **Escuela Felicita Guzman de Caballero**” that involves renovation of an existing classroom and construction of a new classroom and **Escuela Los Pinares and Kinder Jose Misael Ulloa**” that also comprises a one classroom renovation and one new classroom. We have also approved two new projects in Honduras for development:

### “The Tree School “

#### **Escuela Jose Cecilio del Valle**

This elementary has 94 students in grades 1 to 6 in one classroom. It is way overcrowded.

There are 3 teachers and one gives classes under a huge tree. We will build 3 new classrooms, washrooms and a septic system



### “Slippery Slope School “

#### **jardin de Ninos Silvestre Galeano Licon**

Located in close proximity to the primary school Escuela Jose Cecilio del Valle, this existing kinder has an enrolment of 31 students being taught in an overcrowded house. A new kindergarten classroom with washrooms will be constructed.
